#### Summer Trail Work

The Adirondack Mountain Club Volunteer trail crew was on site the last week of June. The four person crew was very skilled and worked hard. Local volunteers Nathaniel and Lois Wells were knowledgeable and skilled team members. They moved the boardwalk that had floated last spring and pegged it in with two foot pieces of 1/2" re-rod and constructed many additional feet of boardwalk. The last day they worked on the upland trail and cut out all the heavy material. This facilitated the work of the two YCC crews that came in mid July. The Ogdensburg YCC crew completed the boardwalks on the lower portion of the upland trail. The Canton YCC crew brushed the wildflower trail, upper part of the upland trail, along the boardwalk and part of the lowland trail, where they got rained out by a violent storm. A TRIBUTE TO DR. JOHN I. GREEN

With the passing of Dr. John I. Green, it is appropriate that we pause and reflect on the outstanding contributions that he made to conservation education in the North Country. He pioneered locally the beginning of the Conservation Field Days, an annual event available to sixth grade students in the county, by enlisting the help of many volunteers knowledgeable in specialties within their career fields or personal pursuits in nature study and environmental concerns. These on-site field classes focused on a wide range of environmental topics and were almost continuous annually from 1966 to the present. Generations have benefited from and remember these experiences as 6th graders.

John was a leader in the group that eventually formed the Indian Creek Nature Center by participating in a long term lease from the Department of Environmental Conservation and New York State. He drew upon his wealth of experience in natural history education, much of it in the field. John was always dedicated to the Center as evidenced by his continued commitment leading field trips, assuming responsibilities in various offices, committee work, helping on work days and projects and as a longtime director. Quite possibly his most enjoyable role was as a teacher, especially of children. He totally loved taking groups of all ages on field walks in any location, each time being an experience that was over too soon for everyone.
