# Welcome to the August 2012 newsletter of the Indian Creek Nature Center!

Fall is almost upon us and, as you can see, there are some great field trips within and around ICNC and our annual birdseed sale will be operating again this year. Please note the membership form in case you have not already sent in your annual dues; the center depends on this annual income for maintenance and upkeep supplies. We also depend on voluntary help for our twice annual 'Work Days'. In this regard, thanks are due to the YCC for their clearance work this summer, and to the boy scouts earlier in the year.

A number of new features have recently been put in place: new boards and a guide to specific features on the revised Lowland Trail; a complete resurface of the main entrance gravel road; and, very soon, a new map and sign for the main entrance parking lot, which should be in place early in the fall. Thanks to the DEC for the last two items and for their regular

mowing of entrance road and trails.

We have experienced one of the driest of summers - one that raises issues of climate change and likely related increases in weather volatility. Both clearly affect the center. The latter in terms of increased blow-downs and trail blockages and the former in the longer-term effect of changing habitats. Modification of habitat is clearly of concern for nature centers like ours – do we try to maintain these habitats (and for how long)? Or, just carry out a minimum of maintenance upkeep and allow natural changes to continue unabated? These are serious questions. If you have any comments, suggestions, etc., please let us know.

Finally, a welcome to our three new board members: Ray Erickson, Steve Manders, and Mary Beth Warburton; and a sincere vote of thanks to retiring (Continued on page 2)
